## **Dental Disease**

Dental disease in our four-legged companions is very common. It occurs when bacteria in the mouth cause tartar to build up - this can develop into gingivitis, periodontal disease, and it can affect internal organs if infection enters the blood stream.

Preventative care like daily brushing or feeding a diet designed to prevent build-up of tartar is recommended, but any pre-existing tartar will need a dental treatment under anaesthetic. This involves ultrasonic scaling to remove plaque, tartar and debris as well as polishing to smooth the teeth. The gums are also examined for excess depth indicating tooth infection.
